

CPSE to CSE

- For the 2024-2025 academic year, we anticipate transitioning 53 classified students from CPSE who require various levels of academic support, further supporting the expansion of services that occurred in recent years.
- In 2023-24 we had 45 CPSE students enter Kindergarten classified under CSE. This is the largest cohort of classified students in the district.
- The anticipated services for these incoming Kindergarteners (2024) are as follows:
 - Related Services (29 students)
 - Integrated Co-Teaching (10 students)
 - Special Class 12:1:2 (9 students)
 - Special Class 9:1:3 (5 students)
